DEAR BACH FAMILIES,

Through our PTO newsletters, I've reached out with parking reminders and guidelines for the most important reason...student safety. Thankfully, each time a reminder has been sent, there has been great improvement. And then after a few weeks, another reminder is needed.

This past week I received an email from a resident. It started, "I am a resident of Fourth Street and have long complained about parents parking illegally on the street when they drop off and pick up their children." She shared specific examples with concerns for student safety. Recently she was unable to leave for work because her driveway was blocked.

The resident ended her email with, "I am appalled at the blatant disregard parents have for the safety of the school children and residents of the neighborhood. I expect that it will take a tragedy for these drivers to comply with the law. It seems that existing efforts have not solved the problem. Please do what you can to remedy the situation before that occurs." In her email she expressed appreciation for the cones we place at intersections each morning but she feels more is needed.

Although it was just one complaint, it was important enough to share with our families. Our Bach Community is too great for residents to have the sense that there is a disregard for student safety and residents of the neighborhood.

You will notice Officer Martelle at our intersections during arrival next week. He will help with providing reminders to our families who are not following parking guidelines. Please receive reminders from our staff and teachers with respect, patience, and gratitude. They are all working to keep our kids safe.


